MESSAGE FROM MISS MIDDLEHURST, SENIOR VICE PRINCIPAL

I hope you enjoyed the Bank Holiday weekend, and the cooler temperatures it seems to have brought! Year 11 and Year 13 had an 'additional' day of revision time and their exams have started very smoothly this week; not all students have had exams yet as it has been a number of 'options' subjects for our Year 11s this week, but they will all be involved with the first 'whole cohort' exam on Monday morning which is English Literature. As is so often the case, the Year 13 exams tend to start a little more 'slowly' in the exam period. It was lovely to welcome in some parents and carers of our exam students on Tuesday to discuss the importance of mental health and support in managing the totally understandable worry that some students may feel in the exam period.

Wednesday evening saw our Parents' and Carers' Forum; again, this was an incredibly valuable opportunity to discuss some of the changes within the school and to gain the insights of our parents and carers into how these improvements are working and to learn from their suggestions for continued progress. Working in partnership with our parents and carers, and our wider community, is so important in ensuring that students have positive school experiences so that they are able to achieve the results that they deserve to make the choices they want at the end of Year 11 and Year 13. As always, we are extremely grateful for the ongoing support of our school community.

As I have referenced on numerous occasions – and will continue to do so! – hard work brings about academic success; this means outside of school as well as in lessons in school. Students must ensure that they are accessing their online learning – and paper-based which often occurs in Years 10-13 – so that they are practising and developing the skills and knowledge learnt in class. Donations of non-perishable food items can be dropped off at school reception, marked **FAO Year 9 Envision Team**.

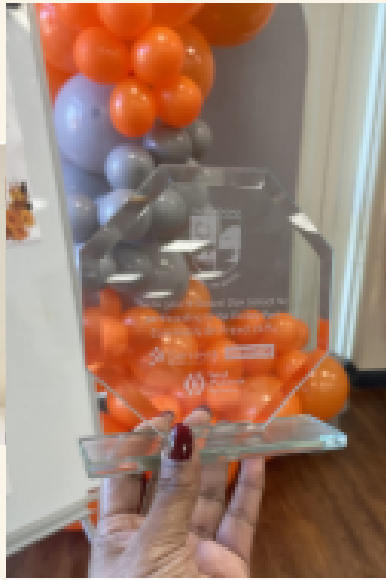
Let's pull together and support this fantastic student-led initiative!

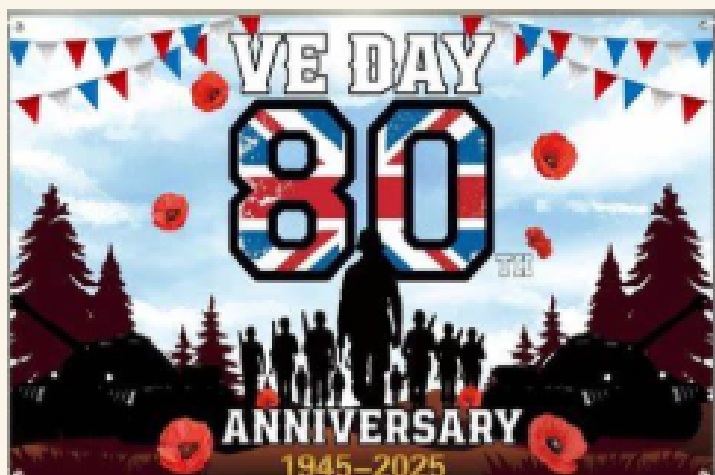
Let's finish by again reflecting on our success so far and thinking ahead over the next 2 weeks is crucial for us all -

Re: Formal Assessments

We continue to be impressed with the hard work and commitment with which our students are showing towards their studies, their dedication to excellence is evident in both their classwork and independent learning. As we approach the final term of the academic year, we would like to inform you about your son's/daughter's upcoming formal assessments in English, French, Geography, History, Mathematics, Religious Education and Science, and how you can best support their preparation.

Your son/daughter will sit formal assessments during a three-week period:

Year Group	Assessment Dates
Year 7	19th May – 6th June
Year 8	19th May – 6th June
Year 9	12th May – 6th June

These assessments allow students to experience formal exam conditions while maintaining a balanced and manageable workload. They are designed to assess students' understanding of the curriculum, highlighting their strengths and areas for further development over the remainder of the academic year and to prepare for the next academic year. The assessments will also enable students to build resilience and prepare them in a supportive way for their studies in Years 10 and 11.

To support students in preparing for these assessments, subject leaders have provided:


- A breakdown of the core knowledge to be covered in the assessments.
- Additional resources and revision materials to aid preparation.

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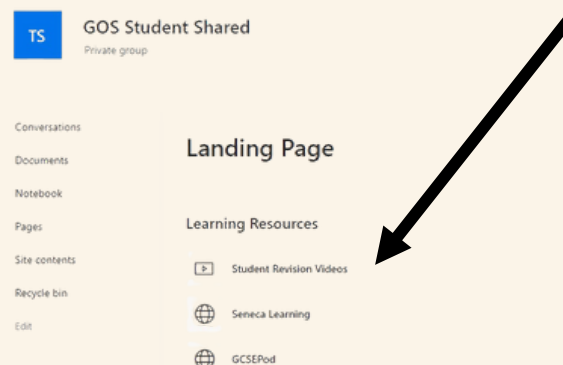

Re: Year 11 and 13 Key Information

As we now enter the most important time of your son's/daughter's time in school so far, I just wanted to remind you and them of some of the key information we have previously shared with you.

You should have all received an email with a copy of their exam timetable, please support them in ensuring they are organised and on time for their exams. We will send out a reminder email the afternoon prior to their exam to remind both you and them of the exams the following day.

Start of the day

Breakfast is available in the restaurant before the start of the school day and we encourage your son/daughter to ensure they have something to eat prior to the exam. **At 8.25am all students should be seated in the theatre** so that we can start the preparation for the morning exam. Please support your son/daughter by making sure they leave the house in plenty of time to get to school, **if they are not in school by 8.30am a member of the year team will be calling home to find out where they are, and, if necessary we will send transport to pick them up.** Any missed exam could result in a fee being charged.

Use of AI

A large number of students over the coming days will also be signing a declaration for their controlled assessments or PSAs (Pearson Set Assignments), in which they will declare:

- Work submitted for assessment must be all their own work and reflect their knowledge, skills, and understanding.
- Misuse of AI (copying, paraphrasing, or failing to acknowledge AI-generated content) is malpractice.



- AI generated content must be properly referenced and reliance on AI will not earn marks.
- AI misuse can lead to disqualification or a ban from future qualifications.
- False declarations have serious consequences.
- Be aware that AI detection tools may be in use, and examiners and assessors can identify AI generated content.



Contingency Days

We have also previously notified you of 2 contingency days that the exams regulator has in place just in case an exam does not take place for a particular reason, these are dates where your son/daughter would need to be available should something unforeseen happen and the exam board changes the timetabled exam date. The 2 contingency days this year are: **the afternoon of Wednesday 11th June and all day on Wednesday 25th June.**

Exam stress

We appreciate that your son/daughter may be feeling anxious about their exams, this is completely normal, however should they need to speak to someone, we have staff available each day for them to have this conversation, if this is the case they can speak to Miss Wilkes, Mr Hughes, Mrs Roper or Mr Mason.

Access arrangements

Some students have been afforded access arrangements for their exams, this may take the form of a smaller room, a laptop, a prompter, a reader/scribe or additional time. Miss Van-De-Akker would have been in contact should these apply to your son/daughter. If your son/daughter is afforded extra time the length of additional time will be identified on the board at the start of the exam, it is really important that they make use of this additional time. Please have a discussion with your son/daughter on how they should be using this time, in many cases it will be to finish questions, but they also need to use this time to carefully check through their answers to make sure everything is complete to the best of their ability and they haven't made a silly mistake.

Exam results

Exam results can be collected on the following dates:

- Thursday 14th August – A level and Level 3 qualifications
- Thursday 21st August – GCSE and Level 2 qualifications
