MESSAGE FROM MISS MIDDLEHURST, SENIOR VICE PRINCIPAL

Students continue to be working very hard inside and outside of school; the work that has been undertaken to improve our homework systems is undoubtedly having a positive impact on the amount of work that students are completing and this will support students with improved examination results. Whilst I refer regularly to Year 11 and Year 13 exams at the end of the year, it would be remiss of me not to also make sure I highlight examinations for other year groups too. Years 7, 8 and 9 will have assessments from 27th April onwards, with Year 10 and 12 having their mock examinations from 16th March; these may feel like they are a long way away, but student preparation in advance is key to success. Teaching staff will provide much more information nearer to the time, but please do keep these dates in mind and ensure that you are talking to your daughter and/or son about these, and keep making sure that they are completing homework. Year 11 and Year 13 students who have external BTEC examinations in January have received their timetables for these this week; as always, if you have any queries about these please get in touch via [Gospel Oak School - Contact Us](#); a reminder, too that it is our Year 11 Parents' and Carers' Evening on Thursday 11th December.

Students have been reminded this week in line-ups about some of the routines for paying for meals at school. The messages that have been shared with students are:

1. If you have Free School Meals, your £2.60 is available for you to use at lunchtime; you cannot use your Free School Meals' allocation at breaktime so you must make sure that your parents or carers have put money on your School Gateway account.
2. If you are eligible for Free School Meals, make sure you have your lunch from either the Bistro or the Restaurant; your parents and carers do not need to be spending money on packed lunches for you when you are entitled to have your lunch in school.
3. For all students, whether you have Free School Meals or not: It is really important that you make sure that you have enough money on your School Gateway account to pay for what you want. If you are not sure, please ask at the tills; debts must be paid for and we are contacting parents and carers to make sure that these are paid. Please remind your parents and carers to check that they have put money on your School Gateway.
4. Christmas Dinner is on Wednesday 17th December and will cost £2.60 or your Free School Meal allocation; the menu is on the plasma screens for you to check.

Please make sure there are sufficient funds on School Gateway – Arbor Pay from 11th December in line with Mr. Lyall's previous communications to you – for all purchases. A reminder that the information about Arbor Pay can also be found on the school website - [Gospel Oak School - Arbor Pay](#) – and please do take the time to read this information.

Attendance Matters – Every Day Counts!

Mr Johnson also led a powerful morning meeting on the importance of **attendance**, especially as Year 9 begin preparing for **KS4 and GCSE Options**.




We've noticed a small drop in attendance over the last two weeks, and it's vital this improves. Here are the key stats we shared with students:

-  95%+ attendance = Strongest chance of a Grade 4+ at GCSE!
-  90–95% attendance = Up to a 30% drop in achieving a Grade 4+
-  Below 90% attendance = Very unlikely to secure a Grade 4 in Maths & English*

Core subjects are the **gateway qualifications** that every employer, college, and apprenticeship looks for. At GOS, we're all about opening doors for our students' futures — and to do this, **we must be in school!** 📖🌟

Re: Revision Strategies for Year 11 Students

You will remember that I wrote to you last month to let you know about the revision strategies that we are supporting our Year 11 students with as they move ever closer to their BTEC and GCSE examinations. Over the last 3 weeks, students have been taught how to create 'flashcards' and have been provided with resources and time to support this.

In assembly today, they have been taught about another revision strategy called 'quizzing'. Again, we will be providing students with the relevant resources in school for this and will provide them with time during their tutor periods so that they can continue to create their revision materials.

We have focused on creating flashcards for Maths, English and Science and will continue with a focus on these subjects for quizzing. It is vital that students end Year 11 with at least a grade 4 in Maths and at least one of English Language or English Literature; students do not want to have to 'retake' either of these subjects as part of their post-16 learning. As I have outlined previously, hard work is the key to good examination results; this hard work needs to take place over a long period of time.

Please talk with your daughter and/or son about their revision and how they are including flashcards and quizzing as part of this. A reminder, too, that it is Year 11 Parents' and Carers' Evening on Thursday 11th December; this is an excellent opportunity for you to discuss revision with subject teachers and the specific topics that your daughter and/or son needs to focus on to ensure that they receive an excellent set of examination results next August.

Thank you for your ongoing support of the work of the school.

Re: Whole School Marking & Feedback

I am writing to update you on our whole-school marking and feedback approach, which has been refined this year to further support our key priority: ensuring all students achieve good outcomes. As a school, we are committed to helping students understand how to improve and our feedback systems are designed to give them the guidance they need to do just that.

Students will continue to receive regular written feedback and a follow-up 'feedforward' task to help them close gaps in knowledge and skills. Teachers provide live feedback in every lesson and homework is given collective feedback, ensuring that all pieces are checked and common strengths or areas for development are shared with the class. Alongside this, students receive individual feedback comments from staff in line with our policy:

- **KS4 and KS5:** Written feedback twice per half term, plus on summative assessments.
- **KS3 Core Subjects:** Once per half term.
- **KS3 Non-Core Subjects:** Once per term.

We have recently introduced a tiered system to our written feedback to ensure that students receive the depth of feedback needed to move learning forward:

- **Tier 1:** Short, immediate feedback to address surface-level errors (in-lesson or at the start of the next).
- **Tier 2:** 20–30 minute targeted reflection and practice activities.
- **Tier 3:** In-depth feedback followed by a full-lesson redraft or reattempt.

This system helps teachers tailor feedback to each student's needs while supporting long-term learning and promoting independence.

Over the coming weeks, we will be releasing a series of short explanatory videos across our school social media channels. These will walk parents and carers through examples of each feedback tier and show how students respond to it in class. We hope these videos will make the system clearer and give you a sense of how feedback looks in practice.

To improve communication between school and home, students will now be routinely instructed to bring their exercise books home so that you can see their work and the feedback they receive. This will help you stay informed about their progress and give you the chance to discuss their learning with them.

It is very important that books are brought back to school for the next lesson. Please help us by reminding your son/daughter to return their books promptly, as they are essential for their day-to-day learning.

If you have any questions about the marking policy or how feedback works in your son's/daughter's lessons, please do not hesitate to contact the school.
