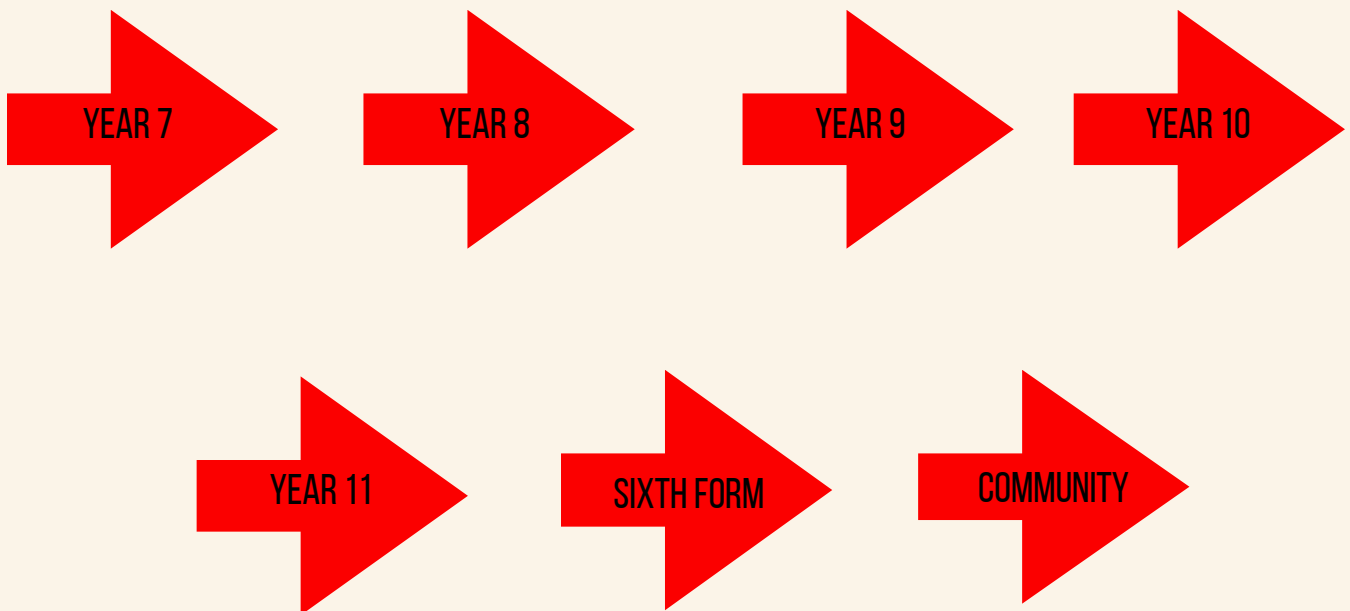

Attendance & Punctuality

Attendance and punctuality remain a serious concern

Recently:

- **We've had many days where 15% of Year 11 were absent**
- **35 – 40 students arrive late daily despite calls home**

Students who are **absent or late are missing vital learning time** and, crucially, **missing targeted intervention sessions during form time**.

These sessions are:

- Led by **subject specialists, including senior staff**
- Focused on **closing gaps in knowledge**
- Designed to secure at least a **Grade 4**

If students are not in school and on time, they are missing essential support.

Not achieving a Grade 4 will mean resitting exams next year.

Expectations are clear:

- Be in school **every day**
- Arrive **on time**, ready to learn

Morning Interventions

Students are being **actively targeted each morning** based on what they are currently not passing.

This is **high-impact support** at the most important time of the year.

Being present ensures students:

- Receive **specialist teaching**
- Improve weaker areas
- Build confidence ahead of exams

Antonia Bance, our local MP for Tipton, Wednesbury and Coseley, has asked us to share information about changes to benefits.

From 6 April, the two-child limit will be lifted. This means families will receive the full Child Element of Universal Credit for every child.

If you already receive Universal Credit, your claim should be updated automatically from April 2026. If this does not happen in April or May, you can send a message through your Universal Credit online journal or call the Universal Credit helpline.

Antonia and her team can help with any problems related to these changes, including the two-child limit. They can also help with other issues such as benefits, housing, the local council and residency. If you need support from your MP, you can email antonia.bance.mp@parliament.uk (please include your full postal address) or call 0121 716 5233.

Please see communication below from NHS Black Country Integrated Care Board

With half-term coming up, parents and carers across the Black Country are being encouraged to check their child's vaccination record and book any missed appointments.

Local catch-up clinics are available, making it easy to get children protected without missing school time.

- Vaccinations offered at these clinics include:
 - MMR (measles, mumps and rubella)
 - MenACWY (meningitis A, C, W and Y)
 - DTaP/IPV (diphtheria, tetanus, whooping cough and polio)
 - HPV (human papillomavirus, where age-appropriate)

If you're not sure whether your child is up to date, don't worry – the team will check and advise you when you book.

Vaccinations help protect your child from serious illnesses and reduce the spread of infection in schools and the wider community.

Appointments are required, so please contact your local clinic to book.
